Candidate's Statement: Hello, I am a season member (North Terrace) and hope to be elected to the Board of the Trust.

As a qualified lawyer and small business owner, I am well placed to add legal expertise and commercial guidance to the Board. My legal experience includes commercial law, litigation and employment law. I advise businesses on their legal, compliance and ethical duties, as well as implementing risk management strategies.
